Catch-up funding report 2018-19

Additional funding is allocated to schools to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of Key Stage 2.

In 2018-19 there was an allocation of £14,700 to support pupils working below expected progress.

Literacy

Additional funding was used to support the following

- 1. New for 2018-19: Appointment of a Teaching Assistant a to work with identified 'catch up pupils' in the summer term 2019.
- 2. New for 2018-19: Use of the Accelerated Reading programme.
- 3. Reading sessions with peer mentors to help pupils develop effective reading strategies and increase enjoyment and confidence in reading.
- 4. Small group intervention (SGI) with a focus on reading.
- 5. New for 2018-19: Delivery of an in-house intensive day course for catch up pupils.

The Catch-up literacy day was attended by 24 pupils. During the one-day bespoke literacy course delivered by an experienced literacy specialist, on average, the students improved their competency in spelling, punctuation and grammar by 46.07%. By the end of the year 73% of the targeted group were making expected progress (MEP).

Pupil comments

- "It was good to work with other pupils who have struggled like me."
- "It was a good day. It helped me to go over things I should know."

Mathematics

Additional funding was used to support the following:

- 1. New for 2018-19: Appointment of a Teaching Assistant a to work with identified 'catch up pupils' in the summer term 2019
- 2. A subscription to MathsBox, a resource for teachers targeted at lower ability and catch up students.
- 3. New for 2018-19: Use of the Connecting Concepts maths programme with key pupils.
- 4. Delivery of a weekly afterschool Numeracy Ninjas Club: Pupils attending the Numeracy Ninjas afterschool club made an average improvement in mental arithmetic of 80.42% over the sessions and 100% of pupils attending had positive attitude to learning in maths at AP1 and 2.
- 5. New for 2018-19: Delivery of an in-house intensive day course for catch up pupils

The Catch-up numeracy day was attended by 24 pupils. The one-day bespoke numeracy course was delivered by an experienced maths specialist. Pupils who attended the intensive day course made an 18.4% improvement in scores between the end of year test compared with baseline assessments. This is compared to a 2% increase in for the full year 7 cohort. By the end of the year 46% of the targeted group were making expected progress (MEP).

Pupil comments

- "It was a great help."
- "Tough, but I worked hard."

Catch up plan for 2019-20

- 1. To deliver high quality teaching and interventions for pupils not achieving expected progress on entry in literacy and numeracy.
- 2. To identify barriers to progress and to intervene effectively to help pupils to 'catch up'.
