

How it works

Students will receive an application form this week

Once you have found a placement you must get the employer to fill in and sign your application form



Health and safety visits will take place and risk assessments will be written

All finalised paperwork will be given out in May



Work experience will take place 24th - 28th June



Expectations

There are limitations to what employers are allowed to let you do, this may be due to GDPR or because of health and safety restrictions. This may affect:

- Legal / Admin
- Construction
- Fitness

Sometimes reality doesn't meet our expectations, however, there is still a lot of value in the process and you will develop a range of transferable skills

- Timekeeping
- Organisation
- Communication

The increase in the number of people working from home has impacted the availability of placements in a number of sectors including:

- Media
- Office based

Finding a placement

- ☐ Speak to friends / family members who may be able to help
- ☐ Search google and make phone calls / send emails
- Go in to shops Fosse Park, Meridian

Employers like to see the effort coming from students rather than parents - it shows you are eager and proactive. This may seem daunting but you could practice your speech before calling/visiting or get someone to check over your emails before sending.

What if I can't find a placement?

LEBC (Leiecstershire Education Business Company) was set up in 1992 as an independent charity, to create a one stop shop for employers, schools and colleges with the aim of helping young people to prepare for working life.

LEBC Application

- Blue application form (collect from Mrs Troy)
- You will be asked to select 3 sector preferences
- You will be asked to identify your travel areas

Please be aware that if LEBC match you to a job role within your chosen sector and travel areas you will be charged full price even if you aren't happy with the role you have been allocated.

LEBC Placement - Sectors

You will be asked to pick <u>3 sectors</u> from the following:

- Engineering and Manufacturing
- Environmental and Land-Based Studies
- Education, Training and Childcare
- Hair and Beauty

Please be aware that job roles within the sectors can vary widely and may not be exactly what students anticipate.

These sectors are in high demand with low availability and LEBC recommend self placements for these sectors.

Payments

The payment for placements covers health and safety visits / checks for all placements, as well as ensuring appropriate risk assessments, insurance and safeguarding procedures are in place to assure the safety of students at their placements.
