Dear Parents and Carers,

Their commitment, alongside the dedication of our staff and the encouragement you provide at home, remains central to the high standards and values we uphold.

### **Key reminders for January**

Your support in maintaining high expectations last term made a real difference, and we are grateful for your continued partnership. Please take note of the following reminders:

#### **Punctuality**

Starting the day on time helps everyone succeed. Students should be lined up in their designated areas **by 8:30 am each morning**. Arriving promptly ensures lessons start smoothly and shows respect for learning and for others. Blaby Road can be busy at the start of the day, so please allow extra time for your journey.

#### **Attendance Matters**

Every day in school counts. Excellent attendance is one of the strongest predictors of success and experience shows that students who attend regularly achieve better outcomes and feel more confident in their learning. Please support us by ensuring your child attends every day unless genuinely unwell.

Term-time holidays cannot be authorised and will be recorded as unauthorised absence. Taking time out of school can significantly impact learning and progress, so we ask that you avoid booking holidays during school terms.

#### **Uniform**

High standards in uniform create a sense of pride and equality, allowing students to focus fully on learning. Please check that your child's uniform meets expectations, including:

- Skirts must be pleated and worn at an appropriate length (just above the knee)
- Trousers worn at the waist
- No jewellery or false nails
- Correct footwear and PE kit
- Leggings are not part of our uniform and should not be worn

If a student arrives without the correct uniform, we will support them with a temporary item and ask for your help in ensuring the correct uniform is in place as soon as possible.

### **Equipment**

Being fully equipped helps students take responsibility for their learning. Every student should bring:

- A fully stocked pencil case (pens, pencils, ruler, eraser, highlighters, scientific calculator, maths set)
- ID card – essential for food purchases, safeguarding and access to certain areas
- Locker key – lockers should be used to store coats, bags and valuables, including mobile phones

*Students entitled to Pupil Premium can receive a pencil case free of charge.*

### **Mobile phones**

Phones must remain in lockers during the school day and should not be used at any point. If seen, they will be confiscated and must be collected by a parent or carer.

### **Break and lunch routines**

The single break and lunch routine introduced last term will continue into the spring term. Please ensure catering accounts are topped up via ParentPay and that students bring their ID card daily to ensure that service can run smoothly.

### **Car park and drop-off**

Where possible, please drop off and collect your child away from the school site as our school car park is limited in terms of space. If you need to use the car park, please drive with care, follow the one-way system, and park respectfully both on and off site to ensure safety and also consideration for our neighbours.

### **Behaviour and standards**

We expect all students to demonstrate the highest standards of behaviour and respect, creating an environment where everyone can thrive. These expectations apply in lessons, across the school site, and within the wider community. Positive conduct underpins effective learning and supports the wellbeing of all.


